



## What's an embarrassing moment that's happened to you while teaching?



The genius student... (extra problem for the break!) A professor had 3 students. One of them was a genius and he decided to test that idea.


He told them: "I will give each of you a cap that can be black or white. You can see the caps of the other students but not your own cap!"
