Trees... The oldest and tallest beings on earth.

- The highest tree, the 'Eucalyptus regnans', stood at the Watts-river in Victoria-Australia. In 1872 he was 132.6 m high. At the end of the 19th century he fell down.
- Today the highest tree is Mendocini a Sequoia near Ukiah-California. This tree is 112 meter high with over 3 m. diameter with an age of more than 1000 years.
- The oldest tree 'Pinus longdeva' is 4800 years old and grows in Nevada, USA.
- The thickest tree the 'General Sherman Tree' - is a 'Sequioadendron Giganteum' and stands in Sequoia National Park in California. In 1989 he was 83.8 m high with 25 m circumpherence 1.4 m above the ground. His diameter is 8.5 meter, his volume 450

m³ and his estimated weight 1.35 million kg.

- The smallest tree is a dwarf-willow (Salix Herbacea). It growth in the Scottish Mountains. It's max. size is 2,5 cm.
- The wild fig tree has the deepest roots (Ficus spp.) in South Africa -Echo Caves – its roots go down to 120 m depth.
