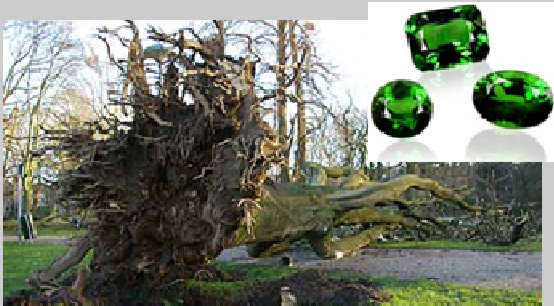

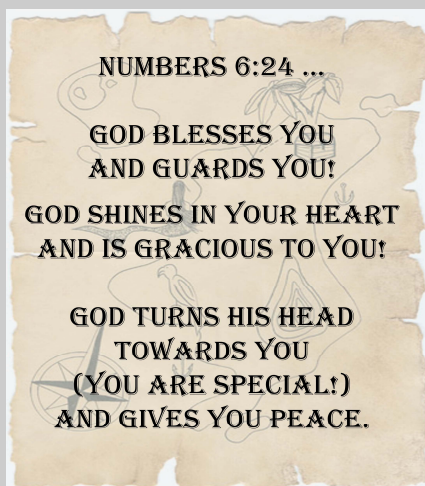
I found a treasure!

Folkers for help. But she couldn't help me. Break time came and she said that whoever hadn't finished the work sheet had to take it home for homework.

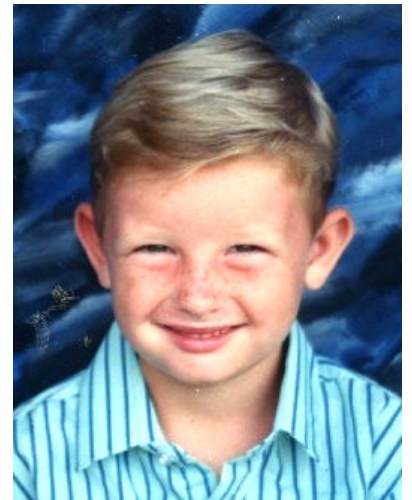

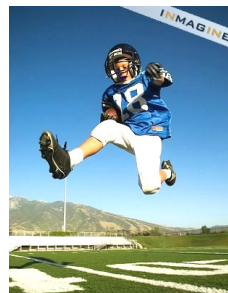

Interesting Facts FG

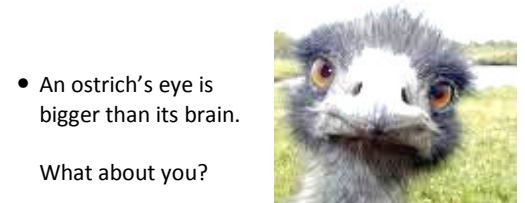
- The average chocolate bar has eight insect legs in it because of how they make it in huge pots.
