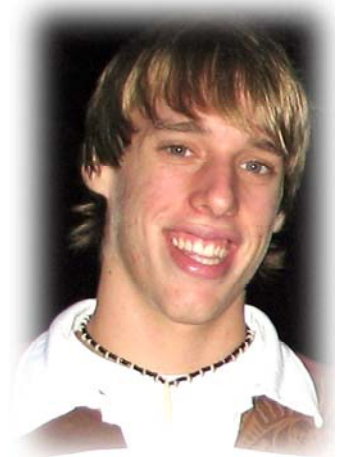
What is some advice you would like to give the younger students?

What is something that has played an important role in your school life that you would like to share?

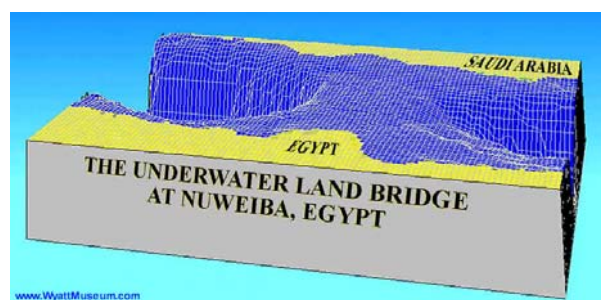

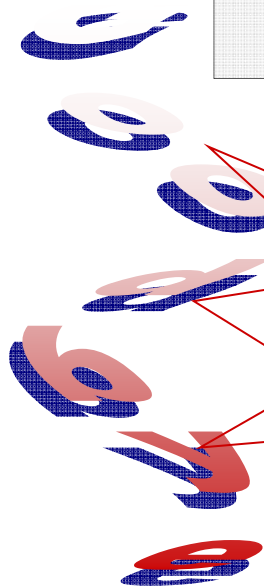
