This is the title of Richard Swenson's book about 'Fascinating Glimpses of God's Power and Design'. I like this book. Let's look at our sense of smell and be impressed by God's design.

Did you know that

- The human nose can distinguish ten thousand different smells, organized by a 1000 genes.
- A dog's smell receptor site however is 17x larger than a human's and is 100x more densely covered with smell receptors, so 1700x better!
- Insects smell receptors (in the antenna) are so sensitive that they are triggered by a single molecule of a smell.
- Mosquitoes can sniff out a human target from as far away as 40 miles! (Wow.... How will a mosquito feel in a big city ?)



Mankind discovered that the mechanism of smell detection is extremely ingenious. How reaches a smell signal the brain?

For me that is a sign that God cares about smell. He likes to use many, many smells in His world, and nothing prevents God to do that on His own majestic way.

In the bible God teaches us also about smells in 2 Cor 2: 14 "... He uses us to spread the knowledge of Christ everywhere, like a sweet perfume..."

Let us be a life giving perfume to the people in PNG to be saved!

Don't let the fact that you can't do it all keep you from doing what you can!!!



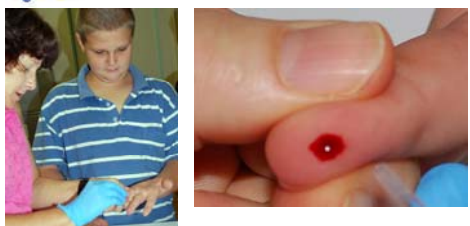

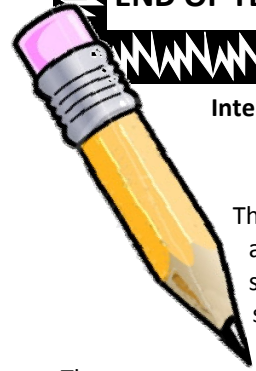




There are even flexible pencils!


