Student of the week!

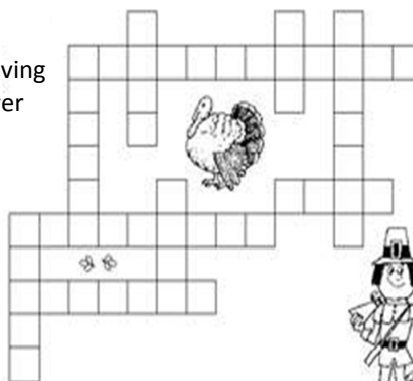
