Coral more complex than humans?



Maybe you know that what we look like; the color of our eyes and all these features, is determined by genetic molecules in our body's cells. We call these sources of information in our cells "genes". Human beings have about 23,000 different genes. Researchers found that the beautiful coral making up our reefs have more than 10,000 genes, and think they could ultimately find that coral has more genes than humans . Evolutionists considered coral to be "a simple animal", with many less genes than humans. But the researchers say its genetic complexity "challenges the notion that life started out simple, then evolved to become more sophisticated". Science simply contradicts this.... These "simple" corals simply occur highly sophisticated... no signs of any evolution.

Another surprising finding has been that coral shares many genes with humans, including those related to the development of immune systems. We are not surprised about these similarities because both corals and humans are created by the same CREATOR not that long ago.
