"Precious Stones"


Just like stones we often don't look very promising. Not me. But inside every person there is a secret: God created us and loves us. He sees something in us!

Gauriamma finds a Treasure



This s a real story about an Indian princess named Gauriamma. She and her father took a trip to England in the year 1850 and actually stayed in Queen Victoria's court. As she lived there she married a highly placed officer from the English court.

The beautiful princess was very wealthy and she became even richer when her rich father died. She was an only child and so she inherited all he had, including many beautiful gems. She was happy for her good fortune, but it didn't last long because she became incurably ill.

Being ill she needed much help and in this way she met an ordinary girl named Dora. She wasn't rich nor had a high status in the world. She was just an ordinary girl, though she was completely content, because she knew Jesus had saved her. He was all she needed.

She felt sympathy for the princess who certainly needed a Saviour. On one rainy afternoon she found the princess laying in bed admiring her favourite gems.

"Look Dora", she held up a ruby to show her, "Isn't it beautiful? It's the finest one I own!"

"Oh, than I have one more splendid than yours."

"You do? Please could you show me?"

"Of course mam". She pulled her Bible from her bag, "They are all in this book of mine."

With a question in her eyes she said "Could you show me?"

"Yes but only one at a time"

She opened her bible and found: "... I have learned to be content through all things." Gauriamma didn't answer, but just laid down to rest.

A couple of days later she happily asked Dora: "Would you show me another one of your jewels?"

This time Dora read 1Timothy 1:15 "Here is a trustworthy saying that deserves full acceptance: Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners - of whom I am the worst."

God worked in Gauriamma's life showing her that she was actually really poor and she laid her life in God's hands.

Then she finally understood that her jewels spoke of God and His glory. And so when her illness took its toll on her body her life still went on in heaven.

Precious stones



The Cullinan diamond is the largest rough gem-quality diamond ever found, at 3,106.75 carats = 621.35 g

January 25, 1905, a supervisor in the Premier Mine near Pretoria, South Africa, saw a shiny stone at the size of a fist. He thought it was a joke of the workers, but to be sure he cut it free. He never regretted that effort, for it proved to be the biggest diamond ever found.

The largest polished gem from the stone is named Cullinan I or the Great Star of Africa, and at 530.2 carats (106.0 g) was the largest polished diamond in the world until the 1985 discovery of the Golden Jubilee Diamond, 545.67 carats (109.13 g), also from the Premier Mine.

It was cut into parts by Asscher Brothers of Amsterdam, and eventually into some 11 large gemquality stones and a number of smaller fragments.

Cullinan I is now mounted in the head of the Scepter with the Cross (one of the British Crown Jewels).

Its estimated value is 400 million USD.

Don't throw it in the fire! It will burn!
